Alfred Hertz Memorial Concert Hall

Named for the 1915-30 conductor of the San Francisco Symphony, Alfred Hertz, who left his estate to Berkeley for music. **Hertz Hall**'s 715-seat concert hall hosts free noontime concerts during the academic year. The building also houses the music department's collection of historic organs.

Arts + Design Initiative, Arts Research Center

The Arts Research Center is a think tank for the arts and interdisciplinary space that brings people together from across the university and beyond the university, from across the arts and beyond the arts. The Arts + Design Initiative's mission is to feature, fortifie, and mobilize existing excellence in the creative fields at Berkeley, while fostering dynamic collaboration, innovation, and public access across all arts and design fields, on campus and in public life.

Bancroft Dance Studio

At **Bancroft Dance Studio** students can take dance workshops and special classes within the Department of Theater, Dance, and Performance Studies.

Berkeley Art Museum and Pacific Film Archive

BAMPFA is the university art museum and film archive of UC Berkeley. Each year BAMPFA presents more than twenty art exhibitions, 450 film programs, and dozens of performances, as well as lectures, symposia, and tours. Admission to the museum is free to students.

Berkeley Art Studio and the ASUC Student Union

Berkeley Art Studio offers co-curricular classes in ceramics, photography, drawing, painting, design, and printmaking, open to students and the public. The ASUC Student Union is home to The Public Service Center's C.R.E.A.T.E. student group. Berkeley Institute of Design

Berkeley Institute of Design is a research group that fosters a deeply interdisciplinary approach to design for the 21st century, spanning human-computer interaction, mechanical design, education, architecture and art practice.

Berkeley Natural History Museums

This building houses five out of seven Berkeley's Natural History Museums which provide a uniquely unified approach to the study and dissemination of all aspects of cultural/human and biological diversity, from molecular evolution to human prehistory. Here you can visit: Essig Museum of Entomology, Museum of Paleontology, Museum of Vertebrate Zoology, University and Jepson Herbaria, and Human Evolution Research Center.

Berkeley Writing Center

Berkeley Writing Center builds confidence in students writing and enhances their ability to express rich ideas thoughtfully.

Cal Performances

The performing arts center of **Cal Performances** produces and presents productions of the highest artistic quality, enhanced by programs that explore compelling intersections of education and performing arts.

The Campanile

Also known as Sather Tower, the Campanile is the unofficial symbol of Berkeley. The Campanile plays a daily carillon concert with the help of the **Department of Music**, tells the time, and functions as the most recognizable landmark on campus.

CITRIS, CITRIS Tech Museum, Berkeley Center for New Media

Home of the Center for Information Technology Research in the Interest of Society (CITRIS), CITRIS Tech Museum, and Berkeley Center for New Media, a focal point for research and teaching to critically analyze and help shape developments in new media from cross-disciplinary and global perspectives that emphasize humanities and the public interest.

College of Environmental Design

One of the world's most distinguished laboratories for experimentation, research, and intellectual synergy, the **College of Environmental Design** is the first school to combine the disciplines of architecture, planning, and landscape.

Creative Writing Minor Program, Media Studies, Interdisciplinary Studies Field Program

The Creative Writing Minor Program, Media Studies, and Interdisciplinary Studies Field Program provide interdisciplinary studies in literature and media fields.

Department of Art Practice, Anthropology Department, Phoebe A. Hearst Museum of Anthropology, and Worth Ryder Art Gallery

Department of Art Practice provides professional art training within the context of a world-renowned public research university, while Anthropology Department and Phoebe A. Hearst Museum of Anthropology, are the first anthropology department and museum established west of the Mississippi. The Worth Ryder Gallery serves the students by giving them experience in creating and installing their artworks in a professional gallery.

Department of English and College Writing Program

The **Department of English** introduces students to the history of English literature, creates an awareness of methods and theories of literary and cultural analysis, and provides continued training in critical writing. The **College Writing Program** works with students at all levels or writing expertise.

Department of Mechanical Engineering

Faculty and students in the **Mechanical Engineering** Design program work on problems affecting the design, synthesis, automation, fabrication, evaluation, and optimization of mechanical systems.

Department of Music

The **Department of Music**, features a special space reserved for the instrument collection of the Baroque Music Ensemble, 38 private piano practice rooms, and the Elkus Room, a 100-seat hall which accommodates lectures, recitals and rehearsals in addition to their academic programs.

Doreen B. Townsend Center for the Humanities and the Art of Writing Program

Home to the **Townsend Center for the Humanities**, which supports more than 60 interdisciplinary working groups and is committed to enriching the existing wealth of intellectual resources at Berkeley, and the **Art of Writing Program**, which celebrates writing as a teachable art through intimate seminars.

Durham Studio Theater

The **Durham Studio Theater** is where the Department of Theater, Dance, and Performance Studies stages productions, symposiums, workshops, and lectures.

Graduate School of Journalism and Reva and David Logan Gallery of Documentary Photography

Graduate School of Journalism, training the next generation of journalists, also houses the **Reva and David Logan Gallery of Documentary Photography.**

Berkeley-Haas Innovation Lab

Berkeley-Haas Innovation Lab is a 2,700-square-foot industrial-style space that enables students to more easily work together and break into small groups with their own partitioned spaces, perfect for brainstorming and project storage.

Hargrove Music Library

Providing strong support for instruction, research, and the performance of music, **Hargrove Music Library** contains thousands of volumes of books, printed music, sound and video recordings, and microforms in addition to manuscripts, rare materials, and archives.

Hearst Greek Theater

Berkeley's very own **Greek Theater** hosts some of the Bay Area's most popular performances by internationally recognized artists and musicians, as well as campus graduations.

Jacobs Institute for Design Innovation

Jacobs Institute for Design Innovation is an academic building and a community space that supports courses, club and competition activities, independent making, and contains 24,000 square feet of design studios and maker labs, providing access to the latest equipment for rapid prototyping and fabrication.

Language and Literature Departments, Department of Classics, Department of History, Department of Rhetoric, Department of Film & Media, Department of Theater, Dance, and Performance Studies

This building is teeming with arts, literature, history, and humanities classes and events that explore the cultural traditions of all regions of the world--from Western Europe to East Asia, from classic to contemporary, from film to performance.

Magnes Collection of Jewish Art and Life

An archive, library and museum, the **Magnes Collection** includes art, objects, texts, music, and historical documents about Jewish art and life.

School of Information

The **School of Information (iSchool)** is a professional school committed to expanding access to information and to improving its usability, reliability, and credibility while preserving security and privacy.

The University Libraries Bancroft Library and The University Archive Gallery

The Bancroft Library is the special collections library at UC Berkeley and is one of the largest and most heavily used libraries of manuscripts, rare books, and unique materials in the United States. The University Archive Gallery is also on site.

History of Art Department, Art History/Classics Library, South/Southeast Asia Library

The Doe Memorial Library supports the teaching, research, and instructional needs affiliated with more than fifty academic departments and programs. The History of Art Department occupies the fourth floor with seminar rooms and the Visual Resources Center. The Art History/ Classics Library and the South/ Southeast Asia Library can also be found here.

Berkeley Center for New Media Commons

Moffitt Library is one of the busiest campus libraries. Home to **Berkeley Center for New Media Commons,** Free Speech Movement Café, and the News Paper Display Wall.

Lawrence Hall of Science


Public science museum and research center for K-12 education at the University of California, Berkeley.
